What do we mean by low level disruption?

- Talking unnecessarily or chatting
- Calling out without permission
- Being slow to start work or follow instructions
- Showing a lack of respect for each other and staff
- Not bringing the right equipment
- Using mobile devices inappropriately





What is the impact of low level disruption?



- 5 lessons a day = 5 hours of learning
- low level disruption in each class could mean that you lose ONE hour of learning per day
- across ONE year this could mean that you lose THIRTY EIGHT days of learning
- across FIVE years this could mean that you lose an ENTIRE YEAR of learning





What is Ready to Learn?

What is Ready to Learn?



- Learning system that has been successfully introduced in many schools
- It allows students and teachers to focus on **learning** rather than managing student behaviour
- It allows students to learn more and make greater progress
- It allows students to take **more responsibility** for their learning



We expect all students to follow our THREE 'St. Katherine's Ready To Learn expectations':

- **Be responsible** by arriving on time and fully equipped
- **Be respectful** by listening and speaking politely
- **Be resilient** by remaining on task and working hard

Expectations at St Katherine's



- **Be responsible** by arriving on time and fully equipped
- Uniform and equipment checks each morning
- Pen, pencil, ruler, planner and reading book equipment shop
- After first occasion of non equipment you will receive a **warning**
- Repeat incident within a week 25 minute lunchtime detention
- Failure to attend this detention referral to the Ready to Learn room


Mobile phones, earphones and inappropriate jewellery




- Phone and/or earphones seen in lessons will be confiscated
- Jewellery that is not allowed will be confiscated
- Refusal is defiance and you will be sent to the Ready to Learn room



How does Ready to Learn work?







Ready to Learn language - In class



- *"John, you are not Ready to Learn. You are talking over me and not being respectful.* This is your warning."
- *"John, you are not Ready to Learn. You have arrived more than 3 minutes late and not being responsible. This is your warning."*
- *"John, you are not Ready to Learn. You are not attempting to start the task and not being resilient.* This is your warning."
- "John, you need to go to the Ready to Learn room. You had a warning and now you are talking over me and not being respectful. Please make your way to the Ready to Learn room'

Ready to Learn room expectations



- You will **work in silence** 'exam conditions'
- If you are not 'Ready to Learn' warning issued parents notified
- If you continue to not be 'Ready to Learn' second warning and parents notified
- Further disruption Excluded for ½ day; repeat session in the Ready to Learn room
- Reintegration meeting with parent/carer and pupil



Ready to Learn for Year 7 pupils

Date	Arrangements
Sep 5 - Sep 14	Remainder of the lesson in which they were sent
Sep 17 - Sep 28	2 lessons including the loss of one social time
Oct 1 - Oct 26	4 lessons including the loss of at least one social time
Nov 6 onwards	5 lessons in the Ready to Learn room
