HEADTEACHER'S UPDATE

Dear Parents/Carers

So our challenge is to 'stay together for the next six weeks' as shared with all members of our community this week. We all need to be extra vigilant to help protect us all and thank you to those families who have acted on their vigilance this week.

Reminder: to minimise contact with individuals who are unwell, if you are showing symptoms of coronavirus or have someone in your household who is, you should not be in a childcare setting, school or college. You should be at home, in line with the <u>guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection</u>

Reminder:

For Term 2 we are considering a number of adjustments at St Katherine's as part of our 'tightening up together' approach

- Extra curricular activities beyond the school day are being reviewed as part of our P0 and P6 provision see response below
- All meetings with families will be virtual where possible
- Sixth Form students can leave after their last lesson each day. Students using the school bus can use both quiet study areas within the sixth form
- Class by class release at break and lunch to support spacing between students
- PE lessons to use outside space (weather permitting) to reduce risk with tightly controlled arrangements in place for the changing rooms
- From Thursday 5 November, all staff and students are required to wear a face covering in all corridor spaces including our canteen, sixth form area and PE changing rooms.

Thank you for your support with these changes this week. Students and staff have all adjusted well as we settle back into the rhythm of the term and remind each other of the new routines.

We recognise the introduction of the masks was rapid this week and in the interests of sustainability, we encourage everyone to wear a reusable mask as opposed to the disposable ones. We will have standard masks for sale from next week at SSO.

The suspension of extra curricular activities is deeply frustrating when we all know and recognise how important physical exercise and activity is for all young people. Despite exploring this in depth and from many different angles, the school and PE department are bitterly disappointed by the four week break to our activities. Rest assured we have invested significant time this week exploring this in detail and here is our adjusted offer within the restricted period: <u>Update on after school provision</u>.
