HEADTEACHER'S UPDATE

Dear Parents/Carer,

A busy first week back at school and I trust you have found the communications helpful from the school, clarifying all arrangements and news updates.

For families with children in Year 11, Year 12, Year 13, there have been a number of important communications this week, keeping up with the announcements regarding exams. Please see the letters on our website and you can access our 'update assembly' on your child's google classroom should you wish to. Our thoughts are very much with the students and families who are experiencing such disruption during this time. Rest assured, all decisions we make are always in the best interests of young people and we emphasised this to students in our 'update assembly'.

Regarding the summer exams for Year 11, 12 and 13, yesterday afternoon the Secretary of State indicated a form of 'teacher-assessed grades' will be used to award qualifications this summer. Ofqual, the exams regulator, will now draw up more detailed proposals which will be shared later this term. Until we have further information, our message to all students is to continue working hard, attending all lessons, submitting all work, asking for help where needed to ensure they continue to produce their very best work for each of their teachers. The work students are currently completing is as important as ever.

A huge thank you to all those offering to volunteer with the mass asymptomatic testing programme. This has been setup this week in our lecture theatre and we will begin testing next week for those on site. Given the current low numbers of processing we are able to run the testing programme with current staffing levels. However, we will be in contact when we are preparing for the return of pupils to school.

If you have not already completed our consent form, please complete the <u>RAPID TESTING FORM</u> for each child.

Request for in school provision

We continue to provide in school provision for the children of critical workers and those who may have difficulty engaging with Learning@Home (for example due to a lack of devices or quiet space to study). The government definition of a critical worker includes "Parents whose work is critical to the coronavirus (COVID-19) and EU transition response include those who work in health and social care and in other key sectors outlined in the following sections". Whilst we recognise provision is open to students where one parent/carer only is a critical worker, we would ask that you only request this provision where it is necessary. Our Learning@Home provision means that teaching staff are delivering a full timetable of lessons, resulting in limited availability of staffing on site for those studying in school. We are continuing to follow our safety first principle which is resulting in limited numbers in each room so we can observe social distancing as best as possible. Therefore, if one parent / carer is a non-critical worker working from home, we would ask that, where possible, you consider keeping your child / children Learning@Home.

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Thank you for your continued support and cooperation during this time.

Mrs J Ball	All families	Our local Foodbanks have been in touch to let us know that they will continue to operate as normal during this further lockdown period. We are able to refer families to the Foodbank when they require support so please do not hesitate to contact me via balli@skdrive.org if we can help in any way.
Mr Francis Black	All Years	Over the period of the current lockdown we have suspended our regular bus services and added two temporary routes for students who still are still attending school. Details of these routes can be found here . All students may use these routes without charge and drivers have been instructed to allow anyone with a St Katherine's uniform or a valid Sixth Form ID badge to travel.



Mr Francis Black	All Years	Further support is available for families who are experiencing difficulty with internet access. We can either make an application on your behalf for additional 4G data through your mobile phone provider or in some cases provide a 4G router. Please contact your child's Head of House to see if you are eligible for this support. We have also produced videos that show how to set up Chrome and to work with Google Classroom.
Miss Cave	All Years	Free school meals – are you eligible? We are asking families to check whether they are eligible for free school meals for this academic year. The Coronavirus Pandemic has left many families with different financial situations than before. The worry is that more children will be left facing hunger and malnutrition because parents and carers are struggling financially and are not aware of what they are eligible to claim. You do not need to make a separate claim for free school meals if you are already in receipt or have applied for Housing Benefit or help with your Council Tax. To see if you are entitled to Free School Meals you can apply here

To login, the original password details are needed, so please just get in touch for a reminder.
