Dear Parents/Carers

We are very much looking forward to seeing students return to school next week and we highlight below important information regarding their return to school following their period of isolation.

Plan for testing students

We will be testing students using the Lateral Flow Tests as per the consent forms completed. Students will complete the test during tutor time on the day. Following their test, students will wait for their test result before returning to lessons. During this time, we will endeavour to ensure that students maintain social distancing, thereby keeping any close contacts to a minimum.

Following one on-site test on Tuesday 23 March, students will begin to test at home from Thursday 25 March. Please see the home test communication shared separately for further information.

How the tests work

Students will be supervised by trained staff and parent/carer volunteers. The lateral flow tests are quick and easy to undertake, using a swab of the throat followed by the nose - [video guide for students](#).

Registration

1. Your child will be given a registration card when they are tested
2. When they return home, register their test on the [Test and Trace website](#).
3. Scan the barcode found in the top right hand corner of the card. **The test must be registered on the day of the test.**

Results

Results take around half an hour from testing. We will only inform your child if their test result is positive or void.

- **Positive test result** - your child will be informed and asked to isolate in school as we contact parents/carers and ask you to collect your child. Your child and your household will then be required to isolate for 10 days.
- **Void test result** - the student will be asked to complete the test again in school.
- **Negative test result** - we will not inform your child of a negative result. If they do not receive a positive or void test result after 30 minutes, their result is negative.

FAQs

What if staff or students have been in close contact with someone in school who tests positive?

The staff member or student will be notified that they are a close contact by the school and will need to self-isolate for 10 days in line with [government guidance](#).

What if my child develops symptoms?

This testing programme at school is for people with no symptoms. If your child develops symptoms at any time (including a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste) they must immediately self-isolate and book a test by calling 119 or visiting <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>.

My child has had a positive PCR test in the last 90 days. Should they test using the lateral flow test?

If your child has received a positive PCR test within the last 90 days, we understand that this could produce a positive test result and so completion of the test in this scenario is optional. Please inform your child's Head of House if they have received a positive PCR test within the last 90 days.
