### MESSAGES

Mrs Crocker Designated Safeguarding Lead	All Students and their families	<b>This week Ofsted published the findings of their review of sexual abuse in schools and colleges. Peer on peer abuse has always been highlighted in our safeguarding work.</b> However, recent events both in the national news, such as the murder of Sarah Everard, and in our school community, have thrown it into even sharper focus.
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Following the student protest in May, we have been focussing on listening to students about their experiences of sexual harassment. It is important that everyone feels heard. This has included a range of actions including open forums with all student leaders, tutor time discussions, reviewing our peer on peer abuse policy, increased staff training and expanding the way students can raise concerns in a way that feels safe.

What is critical to our ongoing ability to create a safe space at St. Katherine's School is that all members of our school community fully understand that safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and that this means that when any of us are worried about sexual harassment (or any other safeguarding concern) that they tell someone.

Students and their families can 'tell someone' by speaking to any member of staff - everyone has had training about how to best handle concerns about peer on peer abuse. Alternatively, you can complete the 'tell someone' form on the school website that can be completed anonymously if needed. Including as much detail as possible in this information is important so that we can investigate concerns thoroughly.

We will continue to listen to our students and their families so that we can continue to improve the way we work together to make St Katherine's a safe space for everyone and I would encourage you to get in touch with me at school if there is something you would like to discuss.
