
St Katherine's School Curriculum Principles Teachers & Leaders



Our rich and deep curriculum is **responsive** to the needs of our learners, providing them with **enriching** educational experiences which supports them in acquiring **knowledge** that has the power to unlock the ever-changing world. **Subject intricacies** are crucial and understood by teachers and leaders. We effectively assess the impact of our curriculum through the use of valid, purposeful, valuable and reliable assessment of our curriculum constructs. We systematically check for understanding and provide clear and direct feedback in order to address any misconceptions and move student learning forward.

Students must be highly literate. As a result of explicit vocabulary teaching, students are confident with subject specific technical language and are confident when articulating this. When armed with multiple, flexible and precise prototypes which are reinforced by experience, students are able to extend and make associations within their learning.



We identify the expected **prerequisite** and **prior knowledge** and skills for learning. This shapes the intent and **sequencing** of our curriculum alongside the delivery of **responsive teaching** within the classroom.

Within each subject, we identify specific and achievable objectives. In order to achieve these objectives, we determine the continuity and **progression** of key **skills**, **themes** and **threshold concepts** between the key stages. This creates a **narrative overtime** which secures interplay between components of the curriculum and commits information to the long-term memory.

Our students come from **diverse backgrounds** with a range of prior knowledge and needs. Our curriculum content takes this into account to **support**, **stretch and challenge** all students to ensure **equal access** to our curriculum.

Curriculum Pathways

The DfE has set the following national targets in relation to EBacc:

- By 2022 75% of students starting year 10 will be studying the full complement of EBacc subjects.
- By 2025 90% of students starting year 10 will be studying the full complement of EBacc subjects.

To qualify in this measure a student must study:

- English
- Maths
- 2 or more Sciences
- A Humanities subject
- A Language subject

At St Katherine's, we offer a broad curriculum and strongly encourage all students to study history or geography at GCSE, hence the increase in uptake over recent years. Students with a passion for languages from KS3 are encouraged to study Spanish or French. All Year 7 in 2022 study either French or Spanish from Year 7 to Year 9.
